

# Toyota Corolla 2025

**Toyota Corolla 2025** While Toyota hasn't released full details yet, here's what we anticipate based on recent trends and updates:

## 1. Engine & Performance

- Gasoline Models: Likely to keep the 2.0L 4-cylinder engine (169 HP, 151 LB-FT torque) with a CVT or 6-speed manual (SE trim).
