

# Hyundai ELANTRA 2026

---

**Hyundai ELANTRA 2026** The 2026 Hyundai ELANTRA is expected to be part of the eighth generation (CN7) of the model, which debuted in 2020 and received a facelift in 2024. While Hyundai has not yet officially revealed details about the 2026 model year, we can make some educated predictions based on recent updates and industry trends.

## Design & Styling:

- Possible minor tweaks to the grille, headlights, or rear bumper for a refreshed look.
- LED lighting, aggressive body lines, and aerodynamic improvements may continue.
