Golden Buzzer Meaning The Golden Buzzer is a special feature on talent competition shows like America's Got Talent (AGT), Britain's Got Talent (BGT), and other global versions of the franchise. Here's what it means:

Key Points About the Golden Buzzer:

- **Instant Advancement** – When a judge or host hits the Golden Buzzer, the act automatically advances to the next major round (usually the live shows or semifinals), bypassing further preliminary judging.
- **Limited Use** – Each judge (and sometimes the host) gets one Golden Buzzer per season, making it a rare and highly coveted honor.
- **Emotional Impact** – It's often used for acts that are exceptionally moving, unique, or outstanding, creating a dramatic TV moment.
- **Golden Confetti & Celebration** – When pressed, the stage lights up with golden effects, and confetti rains down as the audience cheers.

Origins & Popularity

- **Golden Buzzer Meaning** The Golden Buzzer was introduced in 2014 (Season 9 of AGT) to add excitement and allow judges to fast-track their favorite acts.
- It has since become a major highlight of the show, with winning acts sometimes being Golden Buzzer recipients (e.g., Kodi Lee on AGT 2019).

How the Golden Buzzer Works

Who Can Press It?

- Judges (each gets one use per season).
- In some versions (like Spain's Got Talent), the audience can vote to trigger it.

What Happens Next?

- The act skips all future preliminary rounds and goes straight to the live shows (or semifinals).
- In AGT: All-Stars or Champions, it sends the act directly to the finals.

Limitations:

- No judge can use it twice in a season.
- Once pressed, the decision is final (no vetoes).
